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This chapter introduces two more radicals the bamboo radical and the grass radical.

竹字頭 zuk1 zi6 tau4 bamboo radical 草字頭 cou2 zi6 tau4 grass radical

The character for bamboo is: 竹 zuk1. This contracted and the radical became: 杯

The character for grass is: 草 cou2. This contracted and the radical became: ++ or ++

The radicals in Chapters 1 & 2 (\ddagger and \mathbb{E}/\mathbb{E}) are found on the left hand side of the character. But the 'bamboo radical' and the 'grass radical' appear at the top of the character.

We often use the word 'radicals'. Actually, these are 'semantic components' – they are a part of the character that give us an idea of what the character means.

Characters using the 'bamboo radical' often refer to items currently or previously made in bamboo.

Characters using the 'grass radical' are often plants – fruits and vegetables. They are not exactly 'grass' – but the grass radical shows a relationship with plants.
